### Miki Hill

Fr. Shannon was born in 1964 and is a native of Cohasset, Massachusetts. After undergraduate and graduate work in history and education, he taught in Catholic schools for a number of years. Fr. Shannon became a member of the Congregation of the Fathers of Mercy in August of 1994 when he professed vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. He was ordained to the priesthood on June 10, 2000. Presently, Fr. Shannon serves on the mission band of the Fathers of Mercy. The primary apostolate of the Fathers of Mercy is the preaching of parish missions and retreats throughout the country.

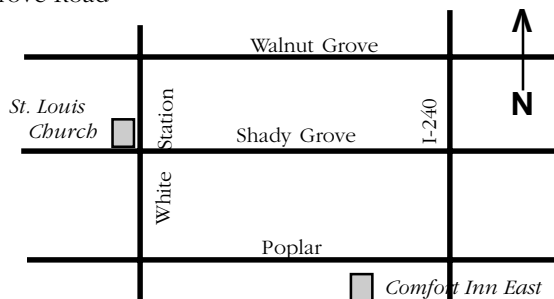
